Parent/Carer Guide to Admissions

Welcome to Bolton College Admissions



The Admissions Team works with all academic departments to ensure that applicants receive a smooth and efficient service, helping them to make the easiest possible transition in to further education.

The Admissions Team:

- Process applications sent to us, for both full-time courses and Apprenticeships.
- Contact the applicant if there is anything we need to clarify on their application.
- Send a text message/email^{*} to the applicant to invite them to book an interview online or over the phone.
- Assist with booking interviews for those who don't want to use our 24/7 online service.
- Request references for applicants (where appropriate). This is usually from their last school attended.

- Send a letter confirming the offer given at interview.
- Send invitations about our main enrolment period.
- Answer questions that applicants, their parents, Connexions workers and schools may have about our admissions process and courses.
- Support all new applicants to make the right decision on their progression from school.
- If an email is not provided on the application form we will write to the applicant however, this may delay our process.



Frequently Asked Questions



Q What is a 'conditional offer'?

A It's a promise that we will provide a course place, as long as you achieve certain criteria. This could include obtaining a particular GCSE grade, finding a suitable work placement or receiving a satisfactory reference.

At interview you will be given a 'Details of Course Offer' form. The offer will be confirmed via email usually 10-15 working days later. If you do not meet the specified conditions, we can still help and will offer course advice if necessary.

Q Parking when dropping off or collecting a student?

A Please be aware that if you are dropping off or collecting a student from College we ask you to use the loading/pull in bays at the side of the College located on Stanley Street. Please do not park on the yellow lines.

There is an NCP car park on Wellington Road at the back of College that can be used (BL3 5DX).

The car park at the rear of the College is not for general use and you cannot park on Bolton One car park to collect students.

Q When will I enrol for College?

A School leavers enrol towards the end of August (we will write with more details nearer the time). Those aged 17+ are usually able to enrol from June. However we will contact you with more information on the enrolment process nearer the time.

Q What support can you offer for learners with learning difficulties or disabilities?

A If you have told us about your disability/learning difficulty on your application form we will already have informed our Learner Support Team who will be in touch to discuss your needs. If we don't know about your disability/learning difficulty please inform us urgently by contacting us on **01204 482 181/195/155**.

Q Will I receive financial assistance whilst at Bolton College?

A Bolton College has a guaranteed bursary (of up to £1,200) for students aged 16-18 who meet one of the following criteria:

- In the care of the local authority or have recently left care
- In receipt of income support or Universal Credit (paid instead of Income Support)
- In receipt of both ESA (Employment Support Allowance) and DLA (Disability Living Allowance) / PIP (Personal Independence Payment)

Students in families where the household income is less than £20,000 may be able to access help with essential equipment needed for their course, help towards travel costs^{*} and free College meals.

Proof of benefits and/or household income will be required and there are terms and conditions attached to receiving financial assistance.

Q What days and times will I attend my course?

A Once you have enrolled, you will be given a timetable of the days and times you are required to be in College. Most courses include15 guided learning hours or more per week. Work outside the classroom will also be required.

Initial Assessments

All new applicants are required to take an initial assessment to find out their maths and English levels.

The results of the assessment help us to place new learners on the right course. The assessments usually take around two hours and we'll send an email containing upcoming dates and times from Easter.

Some subject areas also carry out additional pre-enrolment tests. If this is the case, you'll be told at your interview.

If you left school with a GCSE English and/or Maths at Grade 3 (D) or below you'll study English and Maths to gain a GCSE Grade 9-4 (A*-C).

FAQs

1. I'm no good at English and maths. What's the point?

We think you can be and we can prove it. The teaching and learning approach to English and maths at College is very different from school - and it works!

2. What if I don't get my GCSE grade 9-4 (A*-C) in English and/or Maths at school?

You will continue to study to achieve these qualifications as part of your study programme, until you gain a Grade 4 (C) (or equivalent).

3. So I can work towards achieving my GCSE grade 9-4 (A*-C) in English and/or Maths?

Yes! You'll study in English and/or maths classes, depending on your current level of achievement.

If you achieved a Grade 3 (D) or 2 (E), you will be automatically enrolled on to a GCSE course. If not. you will study for Functional Skills gualifications - leading to a GCSE at a pace that suits you.

4. What are Functional Skills?

They're not just about knowledge of English and maths. They're about using this knowledge in real-life, helping you to operate confidently and independently.

5. I've already achieved GCSEs grade 9-4 (A*-C). Will I still study English and maths?

Only if you want to, or if you need a Level 3 in English or maths for your desired career or HE course. We would encourage you to continue to develop your skills to give you the edge in the jobs market.
